St. John Neumann Catholic School is a preschool through eighth grade parochial school within the Diocese of Knoxville, TN. The mission of SJNCS is to serve God with loving hearts, joyfully embrace our Catholic faith, and nurture individual and academic excellence.

Our Catholic faith is the center of our school. Students have religion class daily, plus students in PreK3–3rd grade attend the Catechesis of the Good

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program once a week in our atrium. K-8th grade attend mass twice a week, and PreK students attend once a week. All students participate in monthly adoration and benediction. Prayer buddies meet quarterly.



39% of SJNCS families receive some form of financial assistance (including EFS and support from the Diocese and SJNCS)



Fine Arts remain an integral part of our curriculum.
Every Middle School curriculum includes art plus one year long elective:
Choir, Theater, 3D Art or STREAM. Band is offered as an after school elective.
Elementary students have Art and Music class weekly.

Historic Groundbreaking

Construction has begun on the Lydia and Claude Melli building, a middle school expansion that will include state-of-the-art educational spaces and resources for current students and accommodate the school's growing student population. Additionally, the new expansion will provide space for parish youth and adult ministries to use. The building is made possible by a generous gift from Lydia Melli.

This 8,000 square-foot academic expansion will include a science lab, learning lab, collaborative study areas, a research STEM lab, and student gathering spaces. Construction is expected to be completed in fall of 2026. A special groundbreaking ceremony was held in July to commemorate the historic moment.




